Rotary Ann

The term "Rotary Ann" originated in 1914 as a term of endearment for the wives of male Rotary members. The term came about when a group of San Francisco Rotarians chartered a train to the Rotary Convention in Houston, Texas, and the only woman on the train until it stopped in Los Angeles was Ann Brunnier, the wife of Rotarian Bru Brunnier. As the train picked up more delegates, Brunnier was introduced as the Rotarian's Ann, and the title soon became "Rotary Ann". When a second woman named Ann, Ann Gundaker, also boarded the train, the name quickly became "Rotary Anns". The group loved the title and used it for all the wives in attendance.

In 1928, the Rotary Anns became their own organization with the goal of supporting their husbands through social, fundraising, and service activities. The group's original purpose was to: Foster acquaintances among Rotary spouses, Promote support to Rotarian husbands, Help spouses stay informed about the community, and Promote interest in local Rotary projects.

However, the term "Rotary Ann" fell out of favor after the United States Supreme Court admitted women to Rotary in 1987. Today, wives are more commonly known as "Rotary Spouses" or "Partners".



Guy Gundaker became President of Rotary International in 1923 and Bru Brunnier was elected President in 1952. Thus, each of the two original "Rotary Ann"s became the "First Lady of Rotary International



Very few clubs have "Rotary Ann"s now, but many have Partners Organizations; some are stilled called "Inner Wheel." The words "Rotary Ann" can be heard on rare occasions, and now you know.
